


HOPE THROUGH A TOUGH YEAR

It has been an unusual year, hard in many ways. Early in the year my father passed from this life. I have felt fairly intense grief after this. Then we had a powerful earthquake in Zagreb that literally shook me awake and caused considerable damage. Then came the Coronavius pandemic, with its related challenges and restrictions. Because of this, we had to cancel camps in the summer, as well as other ministry activities with young people, that we had begun just this year. There have been plenty of reasons to be discouraged. But we have seen that, in the absence of usual group activities, God has brought to us individual young people who need him. As we make ourselves available to them, individually and personally, God is using us to minister to them, and he is meeting them in amazing ways. The two scriptures below have become personal themes for me through these strange times.

Yet this I call to mind and therefore I have hope: Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. Lamentations 3:21-22

> We wait in hope for the Lord; he is our help and our shield. Psalm 33:20



Interesting Croatia Facts

- The town of Hum (photo above) was first mentioned in the year 1102 A.D. The self-described "smallest city in the world" has a population of 30 and is 100 meters long and 30 meters wide.
- One of the oldest cities in the world, the city of Vinkovci has been inhabited ever since around the year 6200 B.C.
- Evangelical Christians make up less than 1/2 of 1% of the population of Croatia.

NEŠTO VIŠE (SOMETHING MORE)

This is the name of the Croatian non-profit organization we registered this year for our ministry. This allows several benefits, such as: It allows us to acquire official permits to use public spaces for group gatherings, or to rent city facilities. It also gives us greater credibility with the public and with parents. Our motto is: *Together through life, created for more.* We want to come

alongside young people through their lifetimes, and we want to instill in them the belief that we are created for more than just right here, right now.

Vision: To help young people and their families discover and experience the purpose, love, direction, and potential God intends for their lives.

Mission: We do this by providing meaningful experiences and activities, such as youth meetings, camps, music programs, mentoring relationships, and opportunities to enrich knowledge and friendship.




SUMMER EXCURSIONS

Because of the Coronavirus pandemic, we were not able to have camps as usual this summer. Instead, we took the teens on a series of excursions throughout the summer, in small groups. The highlight of these excursions was a trip to the island of Krk (photos left), where we swam in the sea and had Bible lessons out by the water at sunset. Krk is usually where we take all the American and Croatian teens together after Champs Camp is over, so the teens enjoyed this. We slept overnight in a youth hostel with no air conditioning, and it was very hot. So sleep was hard to come by, but this allowed for some great informal conversations with the teens late into the night. Out of these experiences developed mentoring and discipling relationships with individual teenagers. We did not have to seek out these relationships. It was as if God was serving them up to us, as you serve someone a meal. This was a reminder to me that our ministry programs are valuable, but it is these individual relationships that come out of those programs that are the most important. Most of these teens are eager to spend time with us and learn to follow Jesus. Please pray especially for the discipling relationships between me and Leon. David. Maks. and Jan.

YOUTH MEETINGS

Part of our regular work with young people is weekly meetings. We worship, have a Discovery Bible Study, and enjoy snacks and fellowship. We rented an affordable city facility for Saturday activities. We also started our youth choir. Plans were to use the space all day, with a Bible workshop for children; youth choir rehearsal; and worship evening with teens. Because of increasing Coronavirus infections, we had to suspend these activities after just one choir rehearsal. We are now doing weekly meetings on Zoom (all together, and boys and girls separately). We hope we can continue in-person activities in the spring.







LEON, DAVID

Leon (photo left) is 15. He came to us through Champs Camp. He was at first a camper, and then he was a teen volunteer. As a camper he was often a problem. After one extra year as a camper, to see how he would mature, we let him be a volunteer. He did well. Leon is a kid who needs encouraging people investing in his life. He is responding to this kind of attention given to him and

he participates in almost everything we do. Leon meets with me often for mentoring and Bible study. **David** (not shown) is 18. I have known him since he was a young boy. Up until now it was not apparent that he was really interested in spiritual matters. Even now, he says he wants to be together with God, but that he has a good life and so doesn't really see his need for Jesus. He has recently agreed to meet with me regularly, to discuss life and study the Bible. Pray for the hearts of these young men to further open to Jesus.

WINTER CAMP

Our only usual camp experience this year was our winter camp, which we held during the school break in January. Little did we know that we would not be back together again for summer camps. For winter camp, we met with about 15 teenagers for two days in the small town of Samobor, just west of Zagreb. We enjoyed worship, Bible study, games (photo right), and fellowship. We also prepared to serve children the next day in a one-day version of our Champs Camp, which is usually held in the summer. For this camp we paired each teenager with one or two of the children, to be their "big brother" or "big sister" for the day. The children enjoyed usual camp activities: Bible lesson, crafts, games, snacks, and lots of fun. It was a great time for everyone. The teens did a great job in their roles. This was also a great way of building relationships with the teens. My co-worker, Mateja, made an especially good connection with one young lady, Paula. She is one of the teens that has come up through Champs Camp, and is now a teen volunteer. In a quiet and unguarded moment, Paula confided in Mateja about some very difficult circumstances in her life. God used Mateja to encourage her and reassure her of God's love and care for her.





Maks, Jan

Maks (photo left) and Jan (not shown) are both 14. Their parents are part of our church congregation, so I have know them for several years. I also taught them a couple of years ago in our church Sunday school. At that time they didn't seem very interested in the things of God. **Maks** has participated in most all of our activities this year, whether in person or online. He is developing into a fine young man and is fun and a joy to be around. He is also developing a hunger for Jesus. When I asked him if he would like to meet with me each week for mentoring and Bible study, he was eager to accept. He is responsive when we talk and study together. For his age, he has good insight into the scriptures. **Jan** is also a fine young man who needs some input from encouraging adults in his life. Jan has been involved in some of our activities, and seems especially interested in our youth choir. He plays guitar, and was with us playing guitar at the youth choir rehearsal we had before the Coronavirus temporarily shut that down.

I think he will be a vital part of the choir when we are able to restart it. I recently invited Jan to join Maks and I for Bible study each week, and he accepted. I now meet with both of them an hour before church starts on Sundays. After we met at McDonald's recently, I took Jan home and he wanted to talk more. Pray for an increasing hunger for Jesus in these two.
